Courses in italics are Related Area/Cognate courses, which must be taken by spring semester Junior year. Students must take one Speaking Intensive course *outside* of the major, and one Writing Intensive *outside* the major and four Global/Global Nonwestern courses (at least one of which *must* be Global Nonwestern) to fulfill the University's General Education Curriculum requirements. GNS course requires one lab. BIO 105 & 111 does not require a lab, *ATY 253 requires their ATY lab.

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SWK Admissions, Field and Graduation Requirements

For Admissions to the major students must:

- Complete 215 with a C or better
- Have a minimum GPA of 2.5
- Have completed at least 51 credit hours
- Must be **currently enrolled** in **BOTH**, SWK 310 **and** SWK 311 **OR** have completed SWK 215, 310 and 311 with a C or higher (if either SWK 310 or SWK 311 is full, contact the BSW Director)
- Complete an official application for admissions by **December 7th**

Junior year students should take:

- **FALL:** SWK 310 Social Policy and Services
SWK 311 Human Behavior and Social Environment
- **SPRING:** SWK 315 Social Work, Diversity, and Vulnerable Populations
SWK 325 (WI) Research in Social Work Practice
SWK 351 (SI) Professional Skills
SWK 250 (or have taken STA 108 which will count for the GMT requirement also)
- Complete most of your GEC requirements
- University Electives (or PCS 308 Interpersonal Conflict and/or PCS 318 Conflict in Professional Context)

Cognates must be completed by end of spring semester of junior year

To enter field student must:

- Have completed cognate courses: (BIO 105 or 111 or ATY 253, ECO 101 or 201, HDF 212, PSC 200, PSY 121, SOC 101, and SWK 250 or STA 108)
- Met Cultural and Diversity/foreign language requirements
- Completed at least 84 credit hours
- Have a 2.5 GPA or above
- Satisfactorily completed SWK 215, 310, 311, 315, 325, and 351 with a grade of "C" or above
- Students will have to be a **full-time student** your final year
